Ask the right questions and get the most out of Open Day

OPEN DAY offers the best chance to get a real sense of what your future university life will be like. Attending gives you and your family the chance to tour the facilities, meet academics and staff, as well as current students. More than anything, Open Day provides the opportunity to ask the kind of questions that will give you a clear idea of what the university offers. ACU has two campuses in Sydney: one in North Sydney and one in Strathfield, both offering courses in health sciences, education, law and business, or theology and philosophy. Knowing which questions to ask can be confusing. We've done the hard work for you with these top seven questions to ask to get the most out of Open Day.

1. ASK ABOUT THE DEGREE YOU'RE INTERESTED IN STUDYING

You'll learn more about the degree you want to study by attending Open Day than through any other way. Open Day offers the chance to speak face to face with the lecturers, tutors and staff who will play an integral part of your studies. You also might be surprised to find the subjects that appeal to you are in a different course and not the one you had your eye on. This can help you choose the degree that's right for you.

2. CAN I GET CREDIT FOR STUDY I'VE ALREADY DONE?

If you've already done some relevant study that could be applied to the new course you're considering, ask faculty staff if you can get recognition of prior learning to gain credit towards your degree. While you can only apply for credit once you have been accepted and enrolled in your course, credited units replace units you would otherwise study. This means you could

3. ARE THERE OPPORTUNITIES TO EXPLORE AND DEEPEN MY CATHOLIC FAITH?

Attending a university that supports and develops your Catholic faith is an important consideration for many, so make sure you ask what opportunities are available. Some questions could include: Are the teachings of the curriculum informed by the Catholic intellectual tradition? Does the university work collaboratively with Catholic partners to support and strengthen the Church's mission? Is there campus ministry available for pastoral support and faith development? Does the university provide the opportunity for students to worship on campus?

4. ARE THERE OVERSEAS STUDY OPPORTUNITIES?

Want to study health sciences in Italy? Global studies in

Mexico? Theology in Israel? Learning abroad programs can enrich your university experience while counting towards your degree. Some universities such as ACU offer an exciting range of international study opportunities with more than 200 universities worldwide. It's a popular choice at ACU, with more than 25 per cent of undergraduate students travelling overseas during their studies. ACU students can join study tours, complete an internship, do a semester or short exchange, participate in community engagement, or take a unique international Core Curriculum program at the ACU Rome Campus.

5. LET'S TALK ABOUT FEES AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Investing in your future with a university degree is always a good idea but it's important to know what the costs are. You'll also need to think about whether you can work

or keep working while you study. Open Day will provide the chance to speak with experts and check whether you qualify for a Commonwealth supported place (CSP) or another type of loan scheme or government financial assistance. Open Day will also provide an opportunity to find out if you are eligible for one of the hundreds of scholarships ACU awards every year. You can learn about scholarship types, payment methods and how to apply at our scholarships hub.

6. WHAT ARE MY EMPLOYMENT PROSPECTS LIKE?

If the end, most of us enrol in a university degree with the aim of securing a job on graduation. So, it's important to find out what graduate employment rates are like for any course that you're interested in before you enrol. Some university graduates enjoy an advantage over others be-

cause of where they studied, particularly those who study at ACU. 



YOUNG AUSTRALIANS considering tertiary education face an unprecedented level of uncertainty when it comes to employment post-studies.

With as many as one-in-three graduates unable to find work in their chosen field after graduation and an estimate of twelve job changes in one lifetime, the value of vocational education comes under question.
