



Grace under pressure

Students beat COVID blues to achieve first in state

Sydney Catholic Schools' Executive Director, Tony Farley, has congratulated our 2020 HSC top achievers on their outstanding results in a challenging year.

Impressively, five Sydney Catholic Schools (SCS) students have topped the state in their HSC courses, and Brigidine College Randwick has improved their ranking for the second straight year to remain SCS' highest ranked school.

Brigidine is now 49th in NSW, compared to 64th in 2019, according to data derived from the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA).

The rankings are calculated using the ratio of the number of band 6 (90-100 marks) results to the number of exams sat by the school.

Freeman Catholic College in Bonnyrigg Heights had the highest number of All-Round Achievers recipients from SCS' cohort with eight of the total received.

"SCS is absolutely delighted with the HSC results which show consistent improvement," SCS' Director Education and Research, Dr Kate O'Brien, said.

"All students who completed the exams should be very proud of their achievement," Dr O'Brien said.

"It shows persistence, tenacity and this year, more than anything, commitment."

"The creativity to adapt during COVID-19 has resulted in excellent results from teachers and strong rewards for students."

"This is clearly evident in the number of students recognised as distinguished achievers (2511)."

"To achieve a band 6 or 4E result shows the pursuit of excellence, constantly refining a piece of work to continuously improve."

FIRST IN COURSE

St Patrick's College Sutherland performed exceptionally, having two students top the state in an HSC course.

Zara O'Mahony topped Construction and Taylah Pye topped Tourism, Travel and Events.

Jasmine Burrows from Brigidine College in Randwick came first in Chinese Beginners and Nathan Galindo from Good Samaritan Catholic College topped Human Services.

Constance Koh from Our Lady of the Sacred Heart College topped Studies of Religion II, impressing SCS' Mission & Identity Director, Anthony Cleary.

"In 2020, I am very pleased to announce that we had a student who gained first place

"Each year, students from Sydney Catholic Schools achieve very good HSC results in Studies of Religion."

"This is borne out in the large number of students who attain a Band 6, and also in the number of schools achieving above the state average."

SCHOOL RANKINGS

Five of our 33 secondary schools are now in the Top 100 across NSW.

Brigidine College Randwick is ranked 49th, followed by St Ursula's College Kings-

grove at 77th and Bethany College Hurstville not far behind at 80th.

St Clare's College Waverley has climbed nine places into 86th and Our Lady of the Sacred Heart Kensington has jumped 38 positions to move into 98th position. Brigidine College Randwick is ranked 49th, followed by St Ursula's College Kingsgrove at 77th and Bethany College Hurstville not far behind at 80th.

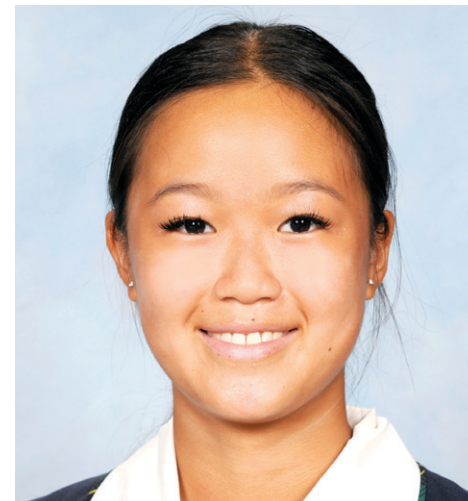
Just outside the Top 100 is Aquinas Catholic College Menai who jumped 57 spots into 101st.

Finding passion in the law

For Danielle Lamborn, a law degree was always going to be a natural fit. While she's determined and prepared to think like a lawyer, her advice is having a little humour, and remaining human, is always the best way to practice.

"I've wanted to be a lawyer since I was a little girl," said Danielle. "Admittedly, I had no clue about what it would really be like, but luckily now that I know, I'm still passionate about pursuing it."

A law degree at ACU was a natural complement to Danielle's career goals.

"ACU promotes ethical legal practice and ensures every graduate gains meaningful legal experience before graduating. I didn't want to just learn the law as it is, but rather I was determined to use my legal training to help others."

"I think it's important to remember that the law is not always a dusty old profession that relies on old laws."

"It can be dynamic and thrilling – a case often involves real people with real-life issues, and lawyers can play an integral role in peoples' lives."

Pro bono work is a requirement for all ACU law students, which was always a highlight for Danielle.

"I think pro bono work is the most important service that any law firm or legal professional can offer."

people cannot afford quality legal assistance – does this mean that they don't deserve it?"

For her pro bono placement, Danielle spent time

working for the Refugee Law Project (RLP), which assists asylum seekers in the Federal Circuit Court who are seeking judicial review of their asylum claim.

"Judicial review is a notoriously difficult process," Danielle explained, "and without legal assistance, an applicant has an incredibly small chance of success."

During her studies, Danielle took a break from the North Sydney Campus to study at Ateneo de Manila University in the Philippines, with help from a New Colom-

bo Plan scholarship.

Being awarded this prestigious scholarship, which is part of an Australian government initiative that seeks to lift knowledge of the Indo-Pacific region, was a total gamechanger for Danielle.

"It completely redirected my life and study. Like most students, I have had to work to support myself through university. But with this scholarship, I have been able to embrace studying in a different country while being financially supported."

"In the Philippines, I was sharing ideas, expanding my knowledge and mapping out potential areas of collaboration with some of the best minds in the international legal community. It is without a doubt the most incredible academic opportunity that I could have possibly received."

"When I started my degree at ACU, I had a fixed idea of what my career would look like. Once I let go of that expectation, great things happened."

Outstanding HSC results

Students from St Mary's Cathedral College achieved results well above the state average in all learning areas, and one student received the highest possible ATAR of 99.95

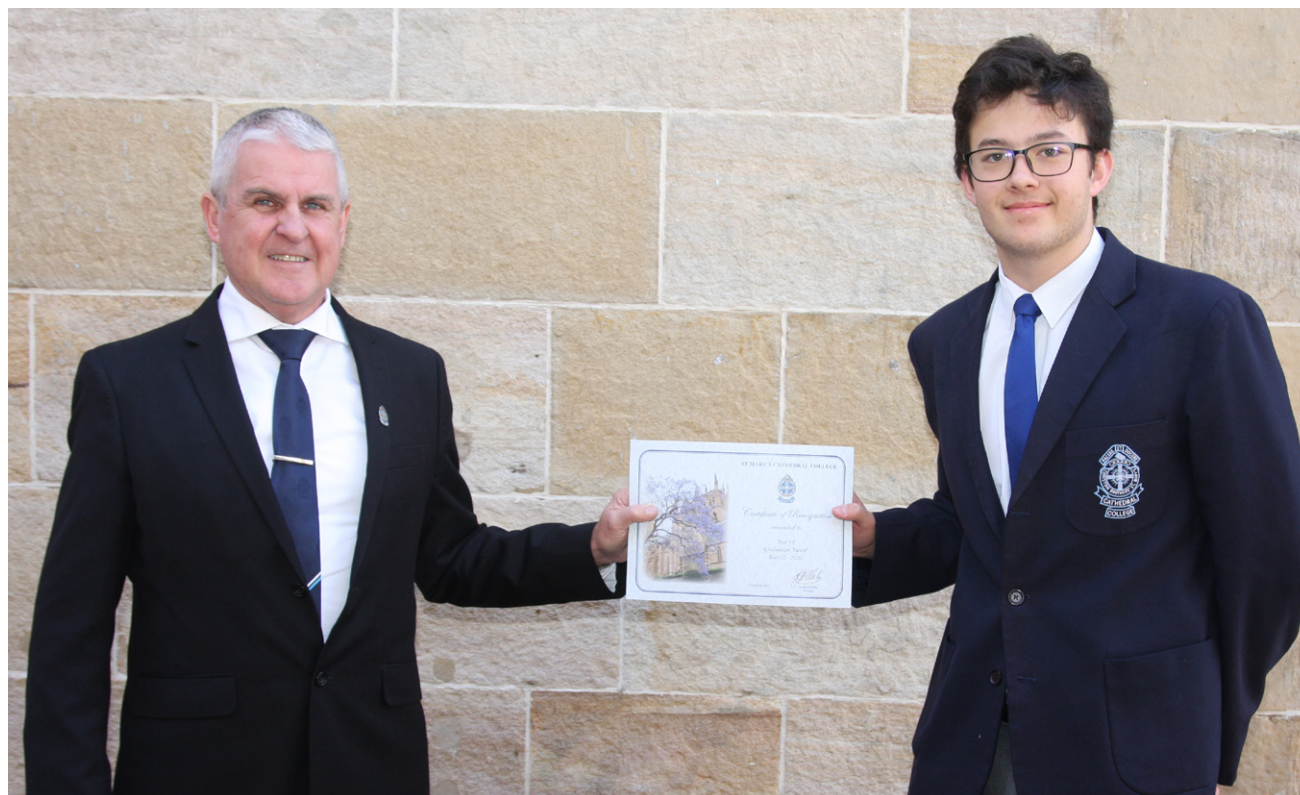
The HSC results of the St Mary's Cathedral College Class of 2020 were among the best in the history of the College.

Students from the College appeared 99 times on the Distinguished Achievers merit list, which recognises students who score a mark of 90% or better. These appearances were shared among 42 students in 26 courses. Expressed as a percentage of papers sat, this figure makes Cathedral College the best-performing boys' Catholic systemic school in the Archdiocese.

The tremendous results achieved by students were reflected in the ATARs. At least 21 students received an ATAR of 90 or above and many other students received ranks far in excess of their expectations.

Amazingly, Cathedral students scored an average mark above the state average in 28 of the 32 courses offered.

Courses with averages more than 5% above the state included Ancient History, Chemistry, Construction, Engineering Studies, English Extension 1, English Studies Examination, Investigating Science, Mathematics Standard, Mathematics Extension I, Mathematics

Extension 2, PDHPE, Studies of Religion II, and Visual Arts. Results in English Extension 2 (15.08% above state average) and Industrial Technology,

(17.28% and the state's greatest number of Band 6 results) were exceptionally strong.

In addition to results connected with the formal exam-

inations, many students have had their work acknowledged by nomination and selection in the various NESA showcases for practical works. Nine-

teen students had their work nominated for the Industrial Technology showcase Shape, and Gabriel Snoch's work was selected for display. Four

students had their Visual Arts Body of Work nominated for ARTEXPRESS and both Daryl Chan and Nicholas Kapruzak had their works selected for the exhibition. Two students had their work nominated for the Music showcase ENCORE.

Of particular note were the achievements of Cullen Lum, 2020 Dux of the College. Cullen was listed as an All Rounder, having scored Band 6 results in all his courses. Cullen was placed first in the Archdiocese in Music 2 (99/100), Mathematics Extension 2 (98), and English Advanced (94), a rare treble. Cullen said finding out that he had received the highest possible ATAR of 99.95, a first for the College, was 'quite the shock', even though he had been happy with his performance in the exams. Cullen attributes his success to both forming good study habits (emphasising the need to begin tasks well in advance of their due date) and to the 'endless help of my teachers'. Cullen plans to eventually study Medicine as a postgraduate at Sydney University and will begin a Bachelor of Science this year.

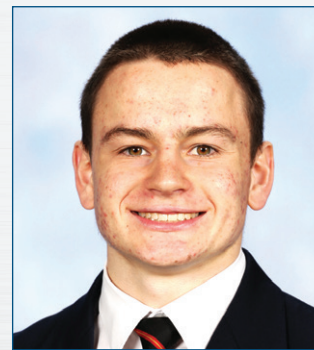
Nick Taylor

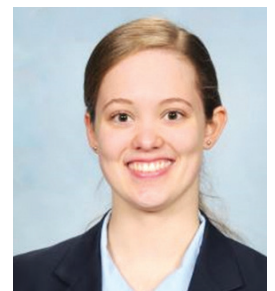

Freeman Catholic College's HSC results are cause for celebration.

The Bonnyrigg Heights secondary college had the highest number of All-Round Achievers recipients from Sydney Catholic Schools' cohort, with eight of the total 46 received.

According to the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA), All-round Achievers lists the students who achieved a result in the highest band possible (Band 6 or Band E4) in 10 or more units of courses in their current pattern of study.

A staggering 25 per cent of all Freeman HSC students achieved Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) scores of over 90 in 2020.

College Male Dux, Vincent Nguyen, achieved the best result of his peers with 99.75, while Female Dux Alessia Poles received the second-highest at the college with a score of 99.3.

Freeman Catholic College Principal, Raymond Wooby, said he was proud of both his students and teachers, putting the fantastic results

down to a proud culture of collegiality at the college.

"It's all about the team – there is no 'I' in Freeman – staff who are dedicated, committed and selfless; students who understand the importance of hard work and are driven to be aspirational and parents who are

willing to support," Mr Wooby said.

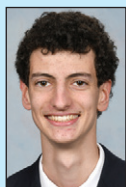

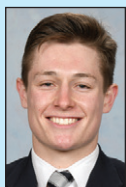
