





LACHLAN STANFIELD

Lachlan Stanfield has excelled in multiple sports during his time at Marcellin. This year Lachlan was selected to represent the NSWCCC Touch Football team. He was also named as team and club captain for the U18's Boys Southern Rebels that competed at the Regional Touch Football Championships. Lachlan achieved some fantastic results this year in Cross Country. He finished in 1st place in the SCS Cross Country Championships, progressing to the NSWCCC Cross Country Championships, where he finished in 2nd place. Lachlan also competed in the NSW All Schools Cross Country Championships (2nd place), and NSW State Cross Country Relays, winning the U20 division, as well as the Australian Cross Country Championships in Adelaide (U20s). In Athletics, Lachlan finished the SCS Conference 1 Carnival in 1st place in the 1500m, 800m and 400m races. Marcus' Swimming success also provided him with the opportunity to Swim in the Qualifiers for the Commonwealth Games and NSW Short Course Championships. Nathan finished third in the U17 Men's Para Discus with a throw of 14.27 metres and 11th in the U17 Para 100 metre race with a time of 25.69 seconds.

"With my achievements, I know I can be an inspiration to other paraathletes to show them that you can achieve your goals no matter what your ability level is". Casting his eye to the future, Nathan said his "goal is to represent Australia at the Paralympic Games and also to continue to be an advocate for para-athletes everywhere". Watch this space!





Patrician Brothers' College Fairfield prevailed in the Peter Mulholland Cup defeating Hills Sports High 20-16 in the Grand Final played on 31 August 2022. After 30 years Pats Fairfield returned to the winner's circle and were crowned the 2022 NSW School Boy Cup Champions. The commitment of the players to come from behind 0-16 to defeat Hills Sports High School 20-16 was unbelievable. The 2022 fairy tale ending echoed the victory of 30 years ago, when Patrician Brothers' College Fairfield defeated Harristown State High School, Toowoomba, by one point in 1992. The Team made the College and State proud when they travelled to Redcliffe, Queensland to play against Ipswich State High School in the National Finals.

Player of the match, Co-Captain and second rower, Joshua Alhazim, commented that "All year we have been the underdogs, [coming] into the grand final as the one percenters" and added that "Without God's blessing and the opportunity of attending such a great school we wouldn't have won."

2022 has been a stellar year for the outstanding front row forward, Jordan Miller.

Jordan played in the victorious U/17 West Magpies Harold Matthews team and was named in the NSW Blues City Representative Team. Jordan was also selected to play the Sydney Catholic Schools' Rep-



resentative Team, then progressed to the NSW Combined Catholic Colleges (CCC) Rugby League Team and was awarded the Most Valued Player. Jordan capped off the year with selection in the prestigious Australian Schoolboys' Rugby League Team which successfully toured Fiji.

It was also a year of outstanding achievement for Yehya Ayache, who was selected in the 2022 Academic Team of the year. He has successfully balanced his sporting and academic aspirations, Yehya played SG Ball for Parramatta this year, and is enrolled to study Engineering at the University of Technology, Sydney.

The 2022 coaching staff was led by Head Coach Frank Pritchard, Assistant Coach William Bourke,

Team Manager Lisa Coluccio, Head Trainer Joshua Institoris-Morgan and assistant trainer, Andrew Khanano. Frank Pritchard, a former NRL player, who represented New Zealand and Samoa at international level, overcame serious covid-related health problems to steer his young players to their Grand Final victory in the Peter Mulholland Cup.

College Principal, Peter Wade commented that "Frank Pritchard has been an inspirational leader not only for our boys in the Rugby League Team, but has dedicated his time and expertise in providing after school homework support to students in the local area in conjunction with Cabramatta Leagues Club, who support a service which provides additional educational support for students in Western Sydney".

This was a great achievement for the players, who have worked tirelessly throughout their years at the College to end their sporting and academic journey on such a successful note.




ANTHONY PAVLESIC - Soccer

New weekly sport fixture Goalball: 'It's a truly inclusive sport'


Sydney Catholic Schools' latest inter-school sports offering – goalball – is proving a huge hit with students, teachers and spectators alike.

The Paralympic sport is being offered at Sydney Catholic Schools as part of the system's first ever Unified All Abilities Interschool Sports Program, allowing athletes with and without a disability to share the empowerment that comes with engaging in sport. The Belles' Tokyo campaign ended when they were defeated 10-6 by Turkey in the quarter final.



WHAT IS GOALBALL AND HOW IS IT PLAYED?

For the uninitiated, goalball is an indoor team sport played by athletes with vision impairment. It has been a Paralympic sport since 1976 and in Term 2 it was introduced as a weekly Thursday sport fixture for secondary students in Sydney Catholic schools.

The object of goalball is for the player to roll a bell-filled ball into their opponent's goal while the opposing players try to block the ball with their bodies.

"Goalball is an amazing sport that's really fun to play," Sydney Catholic Schools' Manager for Sport, Damien Kerr, said.

"Students with and without visual impairment can all join in the action by wearing blackout eye shades to replicate complete visual impairment, and the eyeshades level the playing field for all the athletes."

MATAIRA TUTAKA YR 11


NSW Champion and All Schools Medalist Athletics

St Joseph's/BaiMed Aspiring and Elite Athlete Program

St Joseph's Catholic High School couldn't be prouder of its Aspiring/Elite Athlete Program and athletes! Now in its fourth year, the Aspiring/Elite Athlete Program aims to provide students with the education, skills and support needed to reach their potential in their chosen sport and academic studies. The program is designed to cater for both students who are aspiring or elite athletes, wanting a holistic approach to their development in both sports and academic life. In 2024 we hope to attract more dancers for our specialised "Dance Strong" program.

Key elements of the Aspiring/Elite Athlete Program focus on the whole student: working on strength of the mind, body and attitude. The program encourages students' interest in sports to promote lifelong educated athletes. With the help of a mentor, students develop resilience through persistence in schoolwork, activities and in their ability to bounce back. Students develop great sportsmanship by respecting self and others-students, team members, teachers and coaches.

Our students demonstrate commitment to the program by attending all sessions whilst focusing on school studies and other activities outside of school. Our students are encouraged to give back to the community by volunteering their time to support the development of younger Athletes. St Joseph's Catholic High School is partnered with BaiMed Performance and students in the program participate in their physiotherapy screening, physical fitness and musculoskeletal testing.

From this, each student receives a strength and conditioning program to take back to assist with training in their sport. Each term, the BaiMed team re-tests and creates a new training program for every athlete. These are sport-specific programs that cater for the individual athletes' needs. Athletes are also able to access specialised services with BaiMed staff outside of school hours. This has been especially valuable in terms of

injury rehabilitation. Students also attend education sessions in areas such as sports psychology, nutrition, and recovery strategies. These sessions aid in the development of a positive competitive mindset and skills in perseverance, resilience and preparing the body for improved sports performance. On a fortnightly basis, students participate in a mentoring program facilitated by St Joseph's staff members.

These sessions assist the athletes with goal setting and the development of skills in time management and self-reflection which is essential in achieving balance across their active and academic lives. There have been many athletes in the Aspiring/Elite Athlete Program who have achieved National, State or NSWCCC representation in their chosen sport: Tayissa Buchanan (Athletics & Cross Country), Grace Pomery (Cross Country & Athletics), Flynn Gould-Anthony (Swimming), Tyler Morris (Martial Arts), Aiden McEwan (Boxing) Indiana Surian, (Acrobatics), Caitlin Brooker (Karate) and Emily Hollingsworth (AFL).



Gabby started playing tennis at age eight and, prior to her latest win at the ITF Junior Championships, had a Universal Tennis Ranking of 9.20. Gabby is the state's top female player in the 16 years and under age group.

Year 11 student Adelaide Marshall, competed at the NSW All Schools Cross Country in June, and the last 400 metres saw her sprint from fourth to second place against 45 competitors, with a personal best time of 16:23 minutes. "I was thrilled to have made nationals in the 800 metres," Adelaide said. "I am mostly a middle distance runner but challenged myself to improve my cross country running. In the September school holidays, Adelaide competed at the NSW All Schools Championships placing 3rd in the 400m with a new PB of 56.88, and 2nd in the 800m with a new PB of 2.14. Adelaide started running with Little Athletics at seven years of age and now trains with two coaches,



six days a week, undertaking a combination of running and strength training. "I enjoy what running has brought me, both mentally and physically," she said. "Running has taught me the importance of discipline, perseverance and the fundamentals of living a healthy lifestyle and it is also a good stress release from the demands of Year 11." She will now compete in the Australian All Schools Championships in Adelaide, South Australia, in December.
