



At St Gregory's College, we are very proud of our strong boarding tradition. Our boarders form a special part of the College community and its history, operating as a boarding school for almost 100 years.

We take pride in being a comprehensive College where students of a wide range of abilities are given opportunities to fulfill their boundless potential. We focus on providing all of our students with a balanced education; incorporating a range of learning, spiritual, physical and recreational experiences. Our boarding community brings boys together from all over Australia; predominately from country NSW, but also places such as Lord Howe Island, Queensland, Western Australia, the Northern Territory, and the ACT. One of the great strengths of the College is the semi-rural setting, allowing the boys to enjoy the spacious surroundings and magnificent facilities, whilst being within easy reach of city amenities. The College has five boarding houses, all of which have been recently renovated, and are located directly adjacent to the main College. A comprehensive study program is well established, and the boys can benefit from the assistance of staff and tutors throughout the week and on weekends as required. There are extensive College programs after school in the Learning Centre, open to all students, to assist with homework.

A home away from home

St Gregory's College has been welcoming and educating Boarders from all over the country since its foundation in 1926. For thousands of boarding students, St Gregory's has been their home away from home, the place where they have made lifelong friendships, developed themselves holistically and contributed to the rich history of the College.

Boarders are passionate about the College the spiritually uplifting and well-renowned singing at Sunday Mass is a great testament to this, as well as the chanting and support shown throughout all sporting events. The boys complete a significant amount of community service regularly, assisting at all major school events, as well as particular tasks both in and outside the College.

Commencing as a 'farm school,' Agriculture has always been synonymous with St Gregory's College. Located on hundreds of acres of pristine land in the heart of Southwest Sydney, the College prides itself on the success of its Agriculture and Show team programs, providing unique learning opportunities for our students. Most of our boarding families are from rural and regional Australia and bring a tremendous passion for Agriculture to the College, which continues to enhance its success. Students assist in the daily management of the farm as required. St Gregory's is renowned for its outstanding academic, cultural, and sporting achievements and its vast cocurricular opportunities.

With the boarding houses being situated away from the main school buildings this allows the boys to make the distinction between school and home. At the end of the school day, they head to their House where they are cared for by boarding staff.

Each house offers comfortable accommodation, including individual rooms, and permanent live-in supervisors. The boys are cared for by an extensive team that includes a Boarding Coordinator for both Junior (Years 7 to 9) and Senior (Years 10 to 12) boarding, as well as Stage Based Academic and Wellbeing Coordinators to assist with the student's individual care, as well as live-in boarding supervisors that ensure the Boarding environment is very inclusive and family orientated. There is limited on-site accommodation available for parents and families who are visiting throughout the year and the College

has a Health Centre onsite which has a Nurse on duty five days a week, and an on-call team for our boarders, 24 hours a day 7 days a week.

In their recreation time, boys can use the many College facilities, including the playing fields, swimming pool, tennis courts, basketball courts, cricket nets, music rooms, and gymnasium. There is also an abundance of sporting opportunities on offer with St Gregory's being the only in school in NSW that has two sports days per week: Thursday and Saturday. Students compete in rugby league, rugby union, soccer, AFL, touch football, basketball, cricket, volleyball, golf, athletics, crosscountry and swimming, throughout Sydney and Regional NSW through the Parramatta Diocesan Sport (PDS) and Independent Schools Association (ISA) competitions.

There are currently opportunities for full-time, weekly and part-time

All things to all people - An opportunity for every student to shine!

St Paul's International College's motto is 'All Things to All People' and it offers a well-rounded education to all students, preparing them for playing an individual role in an international world. The small class sizes ensure that students receive individual help and attention in an environment in which their talents and skills can develop and shine.

Developing the potential of every child is central to education at the College. Students don't become lost in the 'crowd'. Established in Moss Vale in 1986 by the Sisters of St Paul de Chartres, the College is a Year 7-12 co-educational day and boarding school for students both from Australia and from overseas.

The College is a mobile phone-free school meaning that students' hand in their phones each morning and get them back at the end of the day. This gives students the best opportunity to engage with teachers and classmates in a rich, communicative environment. As a school of the future, technology is used to enhance learning rather than becoming the focus. The College has updated computer facilities and offers a wide range of subjects including Asian languages, sciences, humanities and sport. The College has dedicated rooms for Robotics, a 3D printer, and takes part in state, national and international competitions. 95% of St Paul's students gain entry to the university



course of their choice. The College is set on 17 hectares of gardens and playing fields including basketball, volleyball, badminton, soccer, tennis facilities and an outdoor gym. It takes part in the Wollongong Diocese Secondary Catholic Schools sports competitions - swimming, cross country and athletics. It also runs spiritual retreats, camps, excursions and many other events including the wellknown International Festival which is held annually in March.

There are 3 boarding houses with an individual room for each student.

Our Mount Erin Boarding community offers a home away from home for a diverse range of students from Year 7 to Year 12. Our mission is to provide an exciting Catholic co-educational journey for Boarders where they can experience new opportunities, learn independence and build lasting friendships

Mount Erin is conveniently located in the centre of Wagga Wagga's CBD hub. With a leisurely stroll through the beautifully manicured heritage streets of Wagga, it is only a 5-minute walk to the main shopping district. This includes many shops, cafes and eateries and ensures plenty of things for boarders to experience in their free time. Boarding students can also easily access the Wagga Library, Conservatory of Music and all sporting activities, including Touch Footy, netball, basketball, soccer, rugby and Australian rules football.

From the moment a Boarder begins at Mount Erin, they are well cared for by professionally developed Boarding Staff who are supported by an Activities Officer, a Transport Officer, an Administrative Assistant and the Head of Boarding. We understand that the transition to boarding for a student can be overwhelming, and the compassionate staff at Mount Erin Boarding strives to ensure that all Boarders feel safe and respected. Each focus area/ group is looked after by a kev Supervisor, and all are supported by other Boarding staff each afternoon and evening. Mount Erin Boarding provides residence for secondary school students who wish to attend either Kildare Catholic College or Mater Dei Catholic College in Wagga Wagga. The residence has two Houses - Nagle House for girls and Rice House for boys. The Houses are led by a Coordinator for each House who is contactable 24/7. The ground floor spaces allow Boarders from both Houses to socialise and work collaboratively during study time. Student leadership consists of the Boarding Captains, Nagle and Rice House Captains, and the Boarding Representative Council.

In 2023 the 'Boarder Blitz' was introduced to Marist in collaboration with the St Vincent de Paul Society, aiming to meet the needs of members of our local community. The initiative partners our boarders with local households in need of assistance, allowing our boys to visit their homes after school two afternoons a week and lend a helping hand.

Students have the opportunity to give back to others through the MATES Social Justice Program including weekly barbecues with the homeless, visits with marginalised members of the community, the annual Sony Holiday Camp for children with disabilities and immersion programs with our Marist neighbours in other cultures

Within our College, our boarders play an integral role at weekly Mass,

assemblies and special occasions as Eucharistic Ministers. This role fosters personal and spiritual growth and empowers them to follow the Marist way of living the Gospel.

Head of Mission, Ms Anna Nasr, is proud of the mission and ministry endeavours undertaken by our students.
