

Students praised for faithfulness

On the feast of the Nativity of Our Lady, Catholic students were celebrated for their 'yes' to God through faith, love and service.

hristopher Nolan's film Oppenheimer has now grossed \$850M in box office sales and is likely to top \$1B, even out-performing some of Nolan's Batman films. The three-hour epic focuses on the life of J. Robert Oppenheimer, the brilliant but complicated American physicist and "father of the atomic bomb."

Oppenheimer was a prodigy. He was proficient in philosophy, classics, poetry, French literature and minerology by Year 7 at school. He studied at Harvard, Cambridge and then Göttingen, where after successfully passing the oral defence of

his doctoral thesis, his examiner remarked "Thank God it's over, he was at the point of examining me!" He was an intellectual peer of Bohr, Heisenberg and Einstein, taught at UC Berkeley and Caltech, and was recruited to lead the Manhattan Project.

Yet the film isn't so much about Oppenheimer's genius, the nuclear bombs and explosions, or the nail-biting race with the Nazis, as it is about Oppenheimer's personal struggles: his grief over the suicide of a former lover who was also a communist his conflict with various scientific peers and bureaucratic overlords, his anxieties about the risks and damage of the nuclear age, and the bitter campaign of his rivals to label him falsely as a Soviet spy.

In one the film's most haunting scenes, after announcing that an atom bomb had just been successfully detonated over the Japanese city of Hiroshima and would likely bring an end to the Pacific war, Oppenheimer's vision of a jubilant and congratulatory crowd quickly morphs into the harrowing screams of bomb victims as their skin

is burnt by the nuclear blast. Soon after the bombings in Japan, he became a vocal opponent of nuclear proliferation and confessed in a meeting with President Harry Truman to feeling as though he had blood on his hands.

Oppenheimer doubtedly a brilliant scientist and successful in carrying out his mission brief. Yet to be remembered as "father of the atomic bomb" is to be remembered for death and devastation, and for initiating a threat of nuclear annihilation that still hangs over our planet today. Intellectual brilliance is not always matched by moral.

Two-and-a-half thousand vears before Oppenheimer, another prodigious talent and polymath named Aristotle distinguished excellences in sport and craft, from intellectual and moral excellence. Intellectual excellence requires study, instruction, experience, and eventually theoretical know-how. Moral excellence requires training and making good choices, repeatedly doing those things that contribute to human flourishing. So "practice makes perfect," whether in playing a musical instrument, sport, languages but especially in the moral life. Hence the saying often attributed to Aristotle that "excellence is not an act but a

To put it another way: we are what we do, we become what we repeatedly do. Dear awardees, you are here because of the habits you have cultivated and demonstrated as faithful children of God: for the repeated acts of leadership and service that you have so generously offered to your communities; for putting the Good News of Jesus Christ into practice. You are not here

for being prodigies—though you are undoubtedly all very gifted-but for what you have done with your talents in the building up the kingdom of

It was inspiring to hear the citations of your classmates describing the many things vou've achieved. Among you are catechists, altar servers, youth group leaders, lectors and extraordinary minsters, cantors, musicians and prayer leaders, social justice advocates, fundraisers, and helpers of the poor, homeless, disabled and more. Each of you has displayed the selflessness at the heart of Jesus' teaching. Through your commitment to living out the Gospel, you've made your school, parish community or family a place of love and communion; you've evangelised countless people through your witness to God's goodness; and you've inched closer to becoming what you were created for, total union with the God who is love.

There are only three birthdays in our liturgical calendar: that of John the Baptist three months after the Annunciation, that of Jesus six months later which we call Christmas, and today's Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary or Marymas. Given that her fiat or yes to God changed the course of history, not in the direction of death. destruction and danger, but life, peace and salvation offered to all, celebrating her birth is very natural. Of all of God's creatures, she gave herself most completely to the service of God and humanity, playing a unique role in the greatest love story ever told, that of her Son Jesus.

Here in this cathedral we celebrate her as the Patron of the church in Australia and Help of Christians. By faith, love and service may you continue to follow her example. Keep choosing the way of goodness and charity, of moral excellence, that your legacy may be eternal! And may Our Lady Help of Christians pray for us!


PHILLIP MAZAR Marist College, **Eastwood**



DOMINIQUE ELIAS Loreto, Kirribilli



SCARLETT O'CONNOR Monte Sant' Angelo Mercy College, North Sydney




SAMUEL SUTTON Holy Cross College, Ryde
