
focus is the annual Concert held at Town Hall, involving the entire College community. As well as, the Visual Arts Showcase, held annually in Chapter Hall, showcasing

College Principal, Kerrie McDiarmid comments, "The College continues to shine, with a particular speciality in the performing arts within Sydney Catholic Schools. This aspect of education in the arts is highly valued and sought after, and is an important aspect of the holistic curriculum offered to the students who attend St Mary's Cathedral College."



Performing Arts

Drama at St Mary's is vibrant and flourishing, engaging students in a range of experiential learning practices including onsite and external workshops with professional theatre companies. Students develop skills as actors, directors and designers, utilising technology in the specialised drama space. Extra-curricular opportunities include the Junior Drama Ensemble, Junior Drama Production, Theatresports, the Sydney Catholic Schools Eisteddfod and Combined School Musicals. 2023 sees the collaborative production of *The Addams Family*, in partnership with St Clare's College, Waverley.

Primary students participate in fortnightly lessons with a specialised Drama teacher. Students develop skills in group work, focus, problem solving and creativity to produce performances and long term projects such as a silent film.

• Senior students have demonstrated academic success in Creative Arts through HSC nominations for Onstage, Art Express and the Sydney Catholic Schools HSC Showcases.

Visual Arts is a dynamic department, which over and above the curriculum incorporates collaborations and partnerships with numerous entities, including the Art Gallery of NSW and Regional Exchange Projects. St Mary's were privileged to be the first school to use the new Lewin Digital Lab at the new Sydney Modern building at the AGNSW. Students were given the opportunity to create their own version of an Aboriginal "ku" dog. The "ku" dogs were scanned and then converted into a virtual object, which the students then transformed into a narrative artwork using iPads and the program Procreate. Workshop leaders then showed the students how to transform these images into 3D virtual objects which could be placed within the Sydney Modern gallery as a virtual space. This glimpse of the possibilities of digital technologies within the Visual Arts learning space inspired not only the students but also our Visual Art staff, paving the way for the future production of new media works.



develop his artistry.

"I was first drawn to performing through watching Jimi Hendrix perform the Star Spangled Banner at Woodstock in 1969. Everytime I get on stage I always aim to feel the connection between me and my instrument and the rush that comes from just playing, it's an excitement like no other."

After graduating Jack wants to

pursue a career in the Music Industry as a performing artist and be able to create and perform his own music. "I see myself hopefully putting together a record of songs that I've written over the years. I also wish to be performing regularly and finding the right demographic for my music".

Jack's advice for any younger students wanting to study at a

Performing Arts school is to "not be afraid to try something again. If in the past you've tried something and fallen out of love with it, don't be afraid to re-attempt that again at another point. I wanted to play guitar as a kid but then a series of bad teachers made me quit after a few months. It was only when I started high school that I realised it was actually still something I wanted to try again and I haven't put it down since."

Masterclass: Learning from Industry Artists

Masterclass is a Southern Cross Catholic College Specialist Program. Fulltime Performing Arts students from Years 9-12 participate in this program weekly. Classes are designed to develop performance skills across a range of disciplines with the aim to provide opportunities for students to work with Industry Artists to network, acquire new skills, and gain insight into working in the creative industry. This year alone, students have worked with Artists, Thomas Worrell; aerial contortionist and performer, on Physical Theatre and Circus skills; Azzam Mohamed; street dancer, performer and choreographer, for a groove workshop; Julia Billington; NIDA graduate, actor, voice artist and yoga teacher, working on acting for screen and; Mitchell Christie; Independent Contemporary dancer, performer and choreographer.

Year 12 student, Danni Cohen, took the concept of 'wasted time' as the initial inspiration for her body of work. She began by considering scenes of everyday life that reflected those small activities that occupy time meaninglessly as a means to explore this concept.

Over the course of her HSC journey, her body of work, Lost in the Hours, developed into a series of technically sophisticated large-scale graphite drawings that depict familiar scenes of individuals engaged in time-wasting activities such as sleeping in, using a mobile phone to scroll through social media, and reading.

Collectively these works build conceptually to serve as a reminder for us to be mindful in how we spend our time, whilst also alluding to the effects of technology on our lives. Influenced by artists Paul Cadden and Steve Wilkin, the greyscale monochrome of graphite pencil imbues her work with a sombre nostalgia for time lost in mindless, meaningless activities.

Danni says, "These small acts seem harmless, but collectively they play a larger role in an unappreciation of the world. In our

everyday lives, this lost time is never acknowledged until it is gone. We spend most of our lives waiting for time to pass by without realising it. I wanted to communicate that time is precious and is worth making the most of, and inspire others to take a moment to enjoy life and their surroundings".

Visual Arts is enjoyed by students across all year groups at St Clare's College. Students have the opportunity to create artworks in a range of expressive forms and visual art mediums. Each year their artmaking experiences are complemented by practical workshops with specialist artists, in addition to excursions to galleries and major exhibitions such as the Art Gallery of NSW's Archibald Prize and the Biennale of Sydney. In the HSC Course, the students' study in artmaking culminates in their Body of Work. Here students have the opportunity to develop their own artwork through deeper and sustained investigations of practice. A selection of one or more works is made at the conclusion of the course and is submitted as evidence of what students know and can do in the practice of artmaking. Each Body of Work is assessed externally by NESA.



Musical Productions

A highlight of 2023 was the production of The Addams Family musical. This was a collaboration between St Clare's College and St Mary's Cathedral College. The students gave two entertaining performances on 17 and 18 October at the Seymour Centre. The student cast were supported by a crew who took on the various roles of management, sound and lighting, prop making, hair, make-up and front of house.

Performing Arts

Students have regular opportunities to perform at College events including Assemblies, Open Days, Learning Symposiums and Performing Arts events. Students also have regular opportunities to engage with industry professionals, participating in workshops on various aspects of both music and drama, including playbuilding, improvisation, musical theatre performance and songwriting and music production.

A history of high achievers 'To know what is right'






