Prospective Choristers and their parents often appreciate the opportunity of meeting the Director of Music, Daniel Justin, for an informal chat and a practice voice trial before making a formal application.

Recently appointed, Justin is a highly accomplished musician who has demonstrated exceptional leadership in the field of sacred music. With an extensive background in choral conducting, organ performance, and music education, Justin offers a wealth of experience and a remarkable musical talent that will further enrich the music program at St Mary's Cathedral.

The Director of Music is always pleased to hear from people who would like to enquire about choristership. "We are looking for bright, happy boys with keen musical ears and the makings of a good voice. They do not have to be the finished product – it's our job to help them get there."

Successful applicants receive a full tuition scholarship to St Mary's Cathedral College. In addition to the tuition scholarship, Choristers receive weekly individual singing lessons.

"As well as offering the finest academic and musical training, and excellent sports coaching, the College aims to foster the fullest possible development of each student. The Choristers play a full part in the College's many academic, sporting, and extracurricular activities," comments McDiarmid.

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CEF program providing school fee support

For the past decade, the Catholic Education Foundation (CEF) has provided opportunities for thousands of students to access a quality Catholic education in the Sydney Archdiocese.

Driven by the core faith values of Sydney Catholic Schools (SCS), the CEF's vision is that no child should be denied an opportunity to have an education in the Catholic tradition due to genuine financial, cultural or social hardship.

Initiated in 2011 and becoming operational in 2013, the CEF coordinates corporate partnerships, community grants, fundraising events and donations to help those students and families most in need.

A core element of the CEF's efforts is the School Fee Support Program, which provides eligible families with assistance to attend one of SCS' 147 primary or secondary schools.

The CEF helps families in difficult circumstances cover the cost of school fees and other charges so that their children are still able to enjoy the benefits of a Catholic education.

Since 2015, the CEF has also supported more than 2,000 refugee students. Through its Refugee Bursary Program, the CEF has lended a helping hand to families who have fled their countries of origin in search of a better life here in Australia.



In collaboration with the CEF, 127 SCS staff took part in the inaugural 'Walk for a Refugee' fundraising event in September, raising more than \$12,000 for the Refugee Bursary Program. The CEF is also committed to

assisting SCS students as they transition from their schooling years to the world beyond. Through the City Link Mentor Program, the CEF provides secondary students with a personal mentor who helps guide students through their studies and encourages the development of life skills.

Introduced in 2016, the program offers financial education support as well

as connecting students with industry professionals, and has helped to inspire dozens of students from underprivileged backgrounds to reach their full potential.

Earlier this year, the CEF announced the inaugural CEF Teaching Scholarship, which supports secondary students who are aiming to enter the teaching profession.

Scholarship recipients are provided with ongoing financial aid as they earn their teaching degrees at Australian Catholic University, together with the opportunity to work as casual support staff members within SCS schools.

These student teachers are paired with an SCS principal, who acts as a mentor along the students' four-year learning journey.

The incredible work of the CEF is only made possible by the generous support of individuals and businesses in the community.

Supporters of the CEF are able to make a life-changing impact on the students and families who need it most, and contribute to the CEF's vision of making education accessible to all.

Students supported by the CEF will have the opportunity to grow academically, socially, emotionally and spiritually, and to live purposefully in a thriving Catholic community.
